#### HARWELL VILLAGE ADVENTURE PLAYGROUND

Work on the Adventure Playground is now under way. A proposed design has been drawn and a small scale model has been constructed, which will be made available for public viewing and comment.

The intention is to construct a large earth mound to support the existing slide with a tyre mound on one side and a timber ramp on the other rising up to a timber fort. A smaller mound will be built to one side with a bridge connecting the two. A concrete tunnel will run through the mound and surrounding this central feature will be other items of play equipment such as swings, stepping stones, a climbing rope and frame, and bars to swing on as well as seats for accompanying adults to relax on.

For the construction of the mound a great deal of earth is needed and this is being dumped on the site. Earth moving equipment will be in action in the very near future to construct the mounds and work on the fort and other play items will then follow. The whole site is to be enclosed within a dog-proof fence; and the play surfaces will be either grass or wood/bark chippings, or a similar soft surface.
